Mackinac Straits Health System Purchases Spinal Surgery Robot

Mackinac Straits Health System (MSHS) became a leader in the field of robotic guidance and navigation through the purchase of ExcelsiusGPS. This platform technology is designed by Globus Medical, Inc. to improve safety and accuracy within the operating room.

Anthony Bozzio, MD is leading the spinal surgery program at Mackinac Straits. He is a board certified orthopedic spine surgeon with an extensive background in robotic surgery.

"I am so proud to help bring this technology into the list of surgical services offered in St. Ignace, and am especially excited for our patients," said Dr. Bozzio.

"We plan to use the system for a variety of procedures, ranging from all types of minimally invasive fusions to more complex revision surgery. I look forward to promoting less invasive procedures through this technology. This will be the only facility to offer this type of robotic surgery in the region."

"This system provides improved visualization of patient anatomy through the procedure to help optimize patient treatment," Bozzio added. "The system is designed to streamline the surgical workflow and reduce radiation exposure to surgeons and staff. This revolutionary robotic navigation platform is the world's first technology to combine a rigid robotic arm and full navigation capabilities into one adaptable platform for accurate trajectory alignment in spine surgery."

"At Mackinac Straits, we are committed to providing the highest quality of care for our patients and staff, and look forward to the exciting opportunities and undoubtable impact this technology will bring to the field of spine surgery," said Karen Cheeseman, MSHS president and chief executive officer.

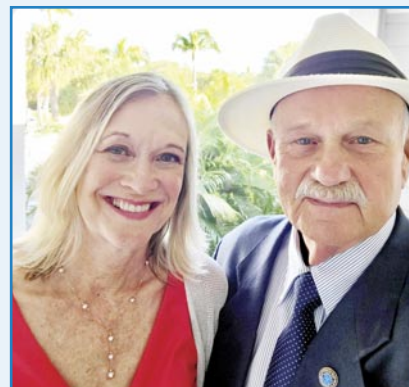
MSH Foundation has purchased several pieces of equipment for use in surgical cases, including robotic spine surgery, thanks to donor support.
